About the BPI Education Fellowship

The BPI Education Fellowship is an academic and professional development program to prepare formerly incarcerated individuals to become leading professionals in the educational space.

The BPI Education Fellowship is a professional development program that engages participants with a variety of experts and practitioners across the diverse field of education. Together, we will think through specific models for change that advocate for greater educational access and opportunity for historically underserved communities. Participants will deepen their understanding of the educational landscape through the lens of community engagement and build skills integral to this

You are eligible for the BPI Education Fellowship if you are/have:

- Formerly incarcerated individual
- Completed Associate Degree
 - Are employed in an education-related field or actively seeking further study or a career in education-related fields
- Proof of COVID-19 Vaccination (Required of all Bard College students and employees)

The BPI Education Fellowship commitment includes:

- Commitment of 9 months
- Two monthly cohort-wide academic and professional development events
- Individualized instruction, advising, and one-on-one engagement with experts and practitioners
- A series of small projects that lead into the Education Symposium final project
- \$6,000 stipend disbursed quarterly

The Fellowship's tutorial model of advanced education in tandem with the cohort sessions will enable each Fellow to broaden and deepen both their general and specialized knowledge in the educational field.
